

THOMAS POINT SHOAL LIGHTHOUSE

Chesapeake Bay

Built and activated in 1875 the light is located off Thomas Point at the mouth of the South River in the Chesapeake Bay. It was built and activated in 1875 and is currently the last unaltered screw-pile cottage-type lighthouse on its original foundation in the United States. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975 and afforded National Historic Landmark status in 1999. The work undertaken by Halpern Architects consisted of its stabilization, restoration, prolonged maintenance and replication and interior design. The goal was to preserve the facility, returning it to its character as if the early 20th century, and altering it only as necessary to allow it to be used as an interpretive "limited access" museum while still maintaining its primary mission as a USCG aid to navigation and NOAA weather station.
